## **Walking with God, and You**

Reflecting on these past weeks of the Lenten season and Holy Week-Easter I've noticed that I've been doing a lot of walking. The journey began with our weekly walking of the Stations of the Cross, and you walked with me. Then we took our freshly cut palms and re-enacted Christ's walk into Jerusalem on Palm Sunday. Side-by-side we proclaimed Jesus to be both the savior of the world and the son of David. Later that week we proceeded to the church to celebrate the Passover feast at which the disciples were shown how to serve one another by washing feet and being nourished by taking His body and blood which became our sacrament of the Eucharist.

From there we walked to Good Friday and experienced the last day of Jesus' earthly life by our proclamation of the Passion Gospel. Our scriptural walk, this time, brought us to the foot of the cross and then a short distance to the cemetery where Jesus was laid in his tomb. After our Good Friday service we departed home to await the Easter Vigil celebration where more walking was entailed. This time it was a journey from the Easter fire to a soon to be enlightened church. Not only did our small candles offer a source of light but all of us were "beaming" with Easter joy. That same night we took one more walk, this time to the font for the baptisms of four parishioners. Instead of walking...they leaped into the font and Deacon Steve proceeded to dunk them into the waters of salvation.

Now, having recounted all of this "holy walking" you might expect me, or the church, to say either, "it's all over" or sit down and take a rest. No way! Our Easter scriptures send us forth to continue our spiritual journey of proclaiming Jesus' resurrection. And our new walking-journey is to prepare ourselves for the great Pentecost feast. Unlike the apostles, who barricaded themselves in that upper room, we are to hit the streets and continue the Alleluia's of Easter Vigil-Sunday. Keep on walking...it's what Jesus' followers do.

WHAT EASTER MEANS TO ME**

After the resurrection, those who encounter the Risen Lord are so deeply touched that they cannot be the same again. The resurrection therefore is the center piece of Christian faith. St. Paul underlines this point when he writes, "If Jesus is not raised from the dead, our preaching is in vain and we are the most pitiable men." (1 Cor 15:14) Easter is not an historical commemoration but a way of life that we celebrate on Easter Vigil and thereafter every day and every Sunday throughout the year at Holy Mass. In the movie *Risen*, the Roman Tribune Clavius, on assignment to find the body of Jesus goes all the way to Galilee where the Risen Lord appears several times. In the end, after witnessing the Ascension, he is completely changed and affirms "I can no longer be the same again."

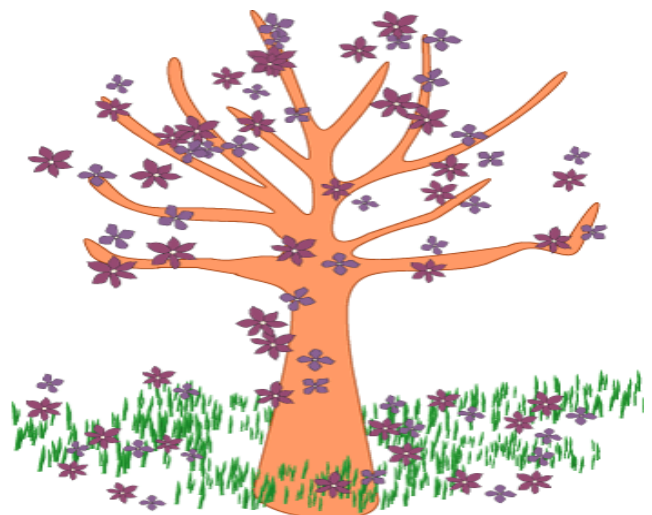
No one encounters the Risen Lord and remains the same. The Joy of Easter as a way of life is transformative - for everyone who has been deeply touched by the Risen Lord. Our Easter faith renders us to be powerful instruments of evangelization. Like the first eye witnesses, we are so filled with the joy of the resurrection that we cannot but share the joyful news. The Catholic Women's Guild Hawaii began July 3, 1859 when 22 native Hawaiian Catholic women and two "foreign" women enrolled themselves into an auxiliary organization of the men's Hawaiian Catholic Association to assist the newly arrived Sisters of the Sacred Hearts of Jesus and Mary.

For over 150 years, Catholic Women's Guild Hawaii has been an organization that fosters and encourages the spirit of service among Catholic women, and assists charitable endeavors, Catholic institutions, and civic groups concerned with the welfare of the general community.

Today, most of the Guild members are elderly and can no longer pursue efforts to make a difference in our local communities. The Guild needs younger Catholic women to breathe new life into the organization.

Lesson 43 - Our Journey from Ashes to Easter

This Lent was perhaps the best Lent in many years for Parishioners of Holy Trinity Church; so many opportunities to prepare ourselves! We began on Shrove Tuesday with Mass and the burning of last year's palms for this year's ashes, followed by our Mardi Gras potluck. On Ash Wednesday, we came for the distribution of ashes, signing ourselves as Disciples, where so many came to begin our Lenten Journey. On March 13, 14 and 15, Fr Mike preached our Lenten Mission where we learned not to fear the Cross, but to embrace it. We realized that Christ's Death brought new Life. Then there was Mass each Friday and Stations of the Cross followed by fellowship and the enjoyment of our Lenten meal; soup and bread (no butter). There was also an opportunity to prepare our palms for the glorious procession into Church on Palm Sunday, culminating with our Holy Week celebration on Holy Thursday with the washing of the feet and the procession of the Eucharist to the Makai Chapel; the Good Friday adoration of the Cross and the Easter Vigil and the reception of our Catechumens to full communion with the Church. A special Stewardship thanks to all who made this Lenten Journey a holy success; a special mahalo to our leader, Fr Mike who supported and directed our committees, our Deacons and Church Staff, the Arts and Environment to Social, Music, Maintenance, Ushers, and Parking committees and those who prepared the food, set up and cleaned up.
